MOULTRIE COLQUITT COUNTY PARKS AND RECREATION COMPLETES MINI-PITCH AT WILLIAM BRYANT PARK COMPLEX

The Moultrie-Colquitt County Parks and Recreation Authority, in partnership with the United Way of Colquitt County, is excited to announce the addition of a newly installed mini-pitch at William Bryant Park Complex! The mini-pitch is partially funded by the Atlanta United Community Fund (AUCF) through its GA 100 program, a mini-pitch build campaign, in partnership with Local Initiatives Support Corporation (LISC). The GA 100 program has a goal of constructing up to 100 mini-pitches in under-resourced communities across Georgia, ahead of the 2026 FIFA World Cup in North America. The campaign's primary objective is to provide these communities with safe and accessible park facilities to enhance the quality of life and promote enthusiasm for soccer.

While construction of the mini-pitch is complete, the area around it is still being upfitted to accommodate the park project and there may be limited access at times. Please use caution and good judgement when entering the mini-pitch area and avoid all portions that are fenced off during this time.

The Atlanta United Community Fund is an affiliated fund of the Arthur M. Blank Family Foundation led by a committee of Blank Family of Businesses associates who inform

funding priorities, evaluate grant applications, conduct site visits and monitor the impact of their grants. The mini-pitch is also partially funded by the Improving Neighborhood Outcomes in Disproportionately Impacted Communities grant that has provided \$1.8 million to revitalize the William Bryant Park Complex. Plans for a grand opening event with Atlanta United player and staff presence are underway for the William Bryant Park mini-pitch, which will be held in early 2025.
